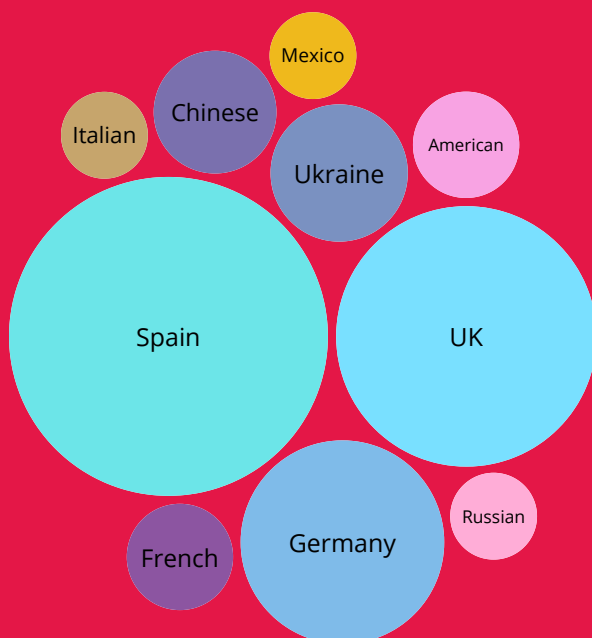

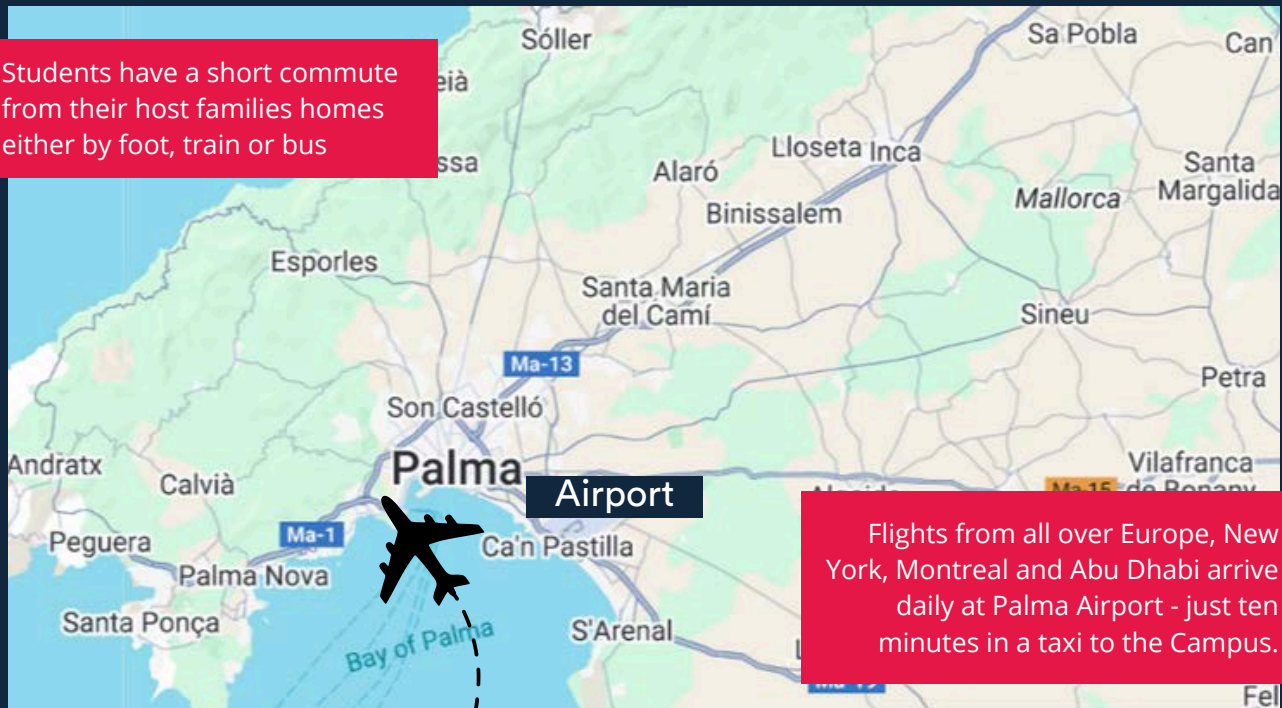

Flights from all over Europe, New York, Montreal and Abu Dhabi arrive daily at Palma Airport - just ten minutes in a taxi to the Campus.

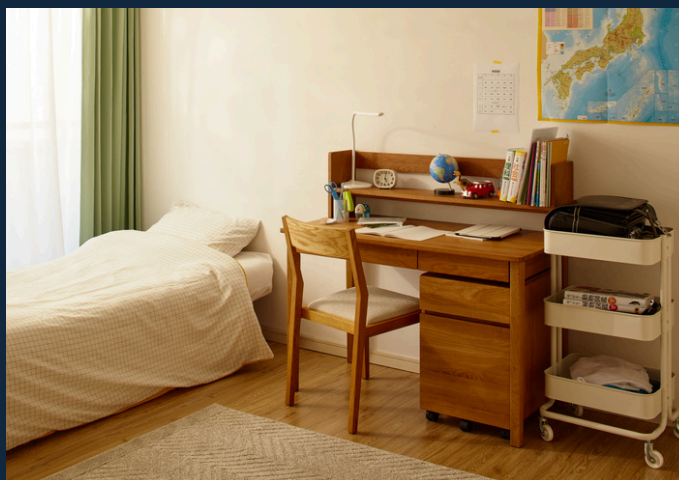
Palma College is located in the centre of Palma de Mallorca surrounded by natural beauty - mountains and beaches.

Host Family Boarding: FAQs

1 How are the host families chosen?

All Palma College host families undergo a thorough selection process including background checks, home visits, safeguarding training and regular reviews. Every host home must meet our high standards for safety, cleanliness, comfort and student support.

Our Host Boarding Coordinator maintains close contact with families and students throughout the year to ensure everything runs smoothly and students feel safe, supported and cared for.

We also operate a 24/7 emergency support line for all boarding students and parents.



3 Are meals and laundry included?

All host families provide daily meals, including breakfast and an evening meal. Dietary requirements — vegetarian, vegan, allergies and cultural needs — are always respected.

Students are encouraged to develop independence by taking responsibility for aspects of their daily routine. They are expected to help with tasks such as doing their own laundry, keeping their room tidy and contributing to shared household responsibilities in an age-appropriate way.

Clear expectations are shared with families and students so everyone knows what to expect from the start.

2 What does a typical week look like?

- College hours: Monday to Friday, 9.00–17.00
- Weekly one-to-one tutorials with every subject teacher
- Independent study time at home or at the college
- Evening routine with their host family — dinner, conversation, relaxation
- Weekends free for activities, exploring Mallorca, sports, beach trips or spending time with their host family
- Optional extracurricular activities such as fitness, dance, music or cultural events

4 What happens if my child needs medical care?

Students have access to excellent local healthcare, including English-speaking doctors, clinics and emergency services.

Should a student need medical attention, their host family and the College work together to ensure swift, appropriate care and communication with parents.

Our SENCO and pastoral team provide additional support for wellbeing, academic adjustments and emotional needs, ensuring every student feels understood and fully supported.

How are the host families and students matched?

Students are carefully matched with host families based on age, personality, interests, routines, location and any specific needs.

We take time to get to know both students and families to ensure a safe, comfortable and positive living environment where students feel at home and well supported.

Matches are reviewed regularly, and adjustments can be made if needed to ensure the best possible experience for everyone.

Which safeguarding standards do you follow?

Your child's safety and wellbeing are our highest priority. Palma College follows UK safeguarding standards and best practice at all times.

Our Host Family Boarding Coordinator has completed NSPCC Level 3 safeguarding training and is closely supported by the Headteacher, ensuring strong oversight and clear procedures.

All host families are carefully checked, regularly monitored and supported so that students are safe, well cared for and able to thrive.

How often can I visit my child?

Parents are very welcome to visit their child and arrangements can be made at mutually convenient times.

Visits are planned in advance to fit comfortably around academic commitments and host family routines, and many families enjoy combining their visit with time exploring Mallorca - a beautiful, safe and welcoming island - as well as having the opportunity to get to know the host family.

Parents are always encouraged to attend parent meetings (these can also be online), performances and College events when possible.

At Palma College, we place great importance on building strong, open relationships with parents, with the understanding that for our boarding students their families may be far away. We work closely with families as a team, valuing regular communication, shared understanding and collaboration, so that parents feel informed, involved and confident in their child's experience and progress at all times.

How can I contact the Host Boarding Coordinator?

Parents are always welcome to contact the Host Boarding Coordinator, Amelia, by email or phone during College hours, and she is also happy to arrange video calls when helpful.

All families will have met Amelia several times, either online or in person, before their child arrives and throughout their time at Palma College, helping to build familiarity and trust.

For additional reassurance, families are provided with a 24/7 emergency contact number, ensuring support is always available whenever it is needed.

Life beyond the classroom



At Palma College, student life extends far beyond the classroom, with a wide range of sports, cultural experiences and extracurricular activities. Students can access tennis, gym training, football, swimming, dance and yoga across Palma, while elite athletes receive personalised timetable support.

Bespoke Enrichment Programme included for all students

The Palma College Enrichment Programme is designed to broaden students' horizons and prepare them for life beyond sixth form. Alongside their A Level and BTEC studies, students take part in engaging eight-week short courses led by external professionals. These hands-on sessions introduce new skills, build confidence and encourage students to explore personal interests. Examples are First Aid and Emergency Skills, Mandarin Chinese and Content Creation with video editing.

The programme also features inspiring keynote speakers who share real-world experiences. Together, these opportunities help students develop independence, curiosity and practical abilities that support their next steps in education and life.
